- <sup>1</sup> Students are required to complete a two-course history sequence *or* a two-course literature sequence. They are also required to complete at least one Core History *or* one Core Literature course in the area not selected as the sequence.
- <sup>2</sup> Students should meet with their advisors for the listing of approved courses. SLHS majors are required to select a minimum of 3 electives (total of 6–8 credit hours) from the SLHS elective course offerings.
- <sup>3</sup> This course can be taken during the summer or fall terms.
- <sup>4</sup> Minimum of a B in SLHS 3400 is required for admission into many graduate speech language pathology programs.
- <sup>5</sup> This course may be taken in person or online before the term in which it is listed in order to be eligible for registration for other major courses.
- <sup>6</sup> Students should choose a chemistry or physics course with a corresponding lab to complete this requirement.
