

# Music (BMU): Composition (Technology) Track (MSLA)

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Composition (Technology) students are trained in the composition of music of a variety of different genres, utilizing state-of-the-art computer and recording studio technology as a significant creative tool. They will take weekly lessons with composition faculty using a digital audio workstation and sound sample libraries, and will develop competency in related areas of music through relevant coursework. Students will develop basic musicianship skills in music theory, history, and conducting courses as well as performing with musical ensembles. Finally, students will be required to present a public senior composition recital as their capstone project. As in the other Bachelor of Music concentrations, students must earn a "C" or higher in all coursework for the major.
